#### **PALS JOB HIRING**

The College of Social Science Help Rooms are hiring PALS (Peer Assisted Learners) for SOC 100 and various ISS courses for the Spring 2020 semester. We will be holding virtual interviews over Zoom. The position provides great preparation for careers and graduate school. The PAL program is a Supplemental Instruction Program and we place PALS in large enrollment sections to support student learning. The PALS conduct study sessions and also facilitate drop in tutoring sessions for students enrolled in their assigned courses.

Applicants need to have a commitment to supporting and working with their peers and be in good academic standing. The ISS positions are open to students in all majors who have completed the ISS sequence or equivalent and I encourage non-social science students to apply. The PALS just need to have taken that course and passed with a 3.0 or better.








#### **NEW ONLINE SUMMER COURSE**

This Summer's offering of HST 425 will concentrate on the exceptionally timely topic of pandemics in history. The course is open to all students except freshmen. Here is a description of the course provided by the instuctor, Professor John Waller:

This course will begin with the first emergence of epidemic disease in the centuries following the birth of agriculture before considering the role of epidemics in the decline of ancient Athens and the Roman Empire, the horror of the Black Death, the appalling epidemiological effects of Europeans arriving in the Americas, reactions to the advent of cholera in North America, and the experiences of modern pandemics: 'Spanish Flu' after World War One, smallpox and polio, HIV-AIDS, and coronavirus. We'll examine in each case the epidemiological and medical characteristics of the affliction, how people tried to explain the outbreak, how they responded to it, how they perceived its victims, and the effects of the disease on levels of inequality and political stability.
