PHI KAPPA PHI HONOR SOCIETY FELLOWSHIP OPPORTUNITY

The Michigan State University Chapter of the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi invites outstanding seniors and recent graduates who have not yet begun graduate work to submit applications for the National Phi Kappa Phi Graduate Fellowship Competition. This year the Society will competitively award fifty-four Fellowships of \$8,500 each, six at \$20,000 each, and two at \$35,000.

To apply for a Phi Kappa Phi Fellowship, you must:

- Be an active member of Phi Kappa Phi (annual dues paid by April 15, 2022) or have accepted membership by June 30, 2022. Applications will be accepted from individuals selected for membership but not yet initiated; see the application form for details.
- Have applied to enroll as a full-time student in a post-baccalaureate program of study for the current academic year. Accredited international institutions are acceptable.

Please note:

- International students are eligible.
- Students registering in all professional and graduate fields are eligible.
- Applicants who have successfully completed 10 or more graduate credits on or before April 15 are not eligible.
- Applicants should not hold other graduate degrees; this should be their first graduate program.
- Winners may defer for up to two years, pending approval.

You may [complete the application online](#) and print it out. You'll then submit the application, official transcripts, test scores (if applicable), work sample, and two letters of recommendation to the Michigan State University Chapter.

Complete applications must be received to the MSU Chapter email (pkp041@msu.edu) by **5:00 pm on Friday, March 4, 2022.**

The Fulbright Program offers international educational and cultural exchange programs designed to increase mutual understanding between the people of the US and the people of other nations. Established in 1946, Fulbright is funded by the US Department of State and operates through various initiatives in over 150 partner countries.

DID YOU KNOW...

ETA awards are available in **75 countries**.

Study/research awards are available in nearly **150 countries**.

Over **200 Spartans** have won Fulbright student awards to **74 countries** – from Argentina to Zambia – since 1949

The competition opens each spring, with an **MSU deadline in early September** and a national deadline in October.

AWARDS

The most common Fulbright programs to which MSU students and recent graduates apply are:

1. **English Teaching Assistant (ETA) Awards** – to teach English abroad
2. **Research Awards** – to conduct research internationally
3. **Open Study Awards** – to pursue a graduate degree overseas
