Homecoming Court members must meet the following requirements:

- Must be an MSU undergraduate student with current junior status who has earned at least 90 credits by Sept. 1, 2023.
- Must have and maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.
- Must be graduating Dec. 2023 or later.
- Must be in and maintain good academic and disciplinary standing.
- Must have a letter of support from a member of the MSU community.

- A copy of your resume.
- A letter of support from a member of the MSU community.
- Your written response to three questions indicated in the application packet.
- A signed background authorization form.
