Demmer Scholars Program Applications Available:

Are you interested in natural resources, science, and public policy? **Apply now through Tuesday, October 31, 2023,** for the <u>William A. Demmer Scholars Program</u>, which includes a three-credit course and internship experience in Washington, D.C., during the summer of 2024.

The program and course run from Monday, May 20 - Friday, Aug. 9, 2024, and will be in person. If health and safety guidelines change in the coming months, we will adjust the experience accordingly.

Students in the Demmer Scholars Program take a 400-level class in natural resources policy that meets one night a week and all day on Saturdays. They also participate in paid internships at federal agencies or non-governmental organizations focusing on

natural resources in Washington, D.C. The experience includes weekend trips, governmental and non-governmental guest speakers, and networking opportunities.

Demmer Scholars Program Overview

All participating students are enrolled for the 3-credit course ANR 491: Selected Topics-Internship - Washington, DC: Elements of Federal Policy Development in Natural Resources. The course will be taught through one two-hour lecture and discussion session each week and augmented by Saturday or weekend field trips designed to ground class participants in policymaking.

Demmer Scholars participants will also complete a 12-week, 40-hour per week paid internship with a government or non-government organization active in natural resources policymaking in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area. Interns earn between \$1,000 - \$2,000 monthly, depending on the internship. Interns will be responsible for transportation to D.C., lodging, and other living expenses.

The Demmer Scholars Program is a competitive process open to upper-level undergraduates and graduate students.


How to apply:

1. Complete this <u>online application</u> to submit your resume and cover letter by **Tuesday, October 31.**

2. Attend the program overview meeting on Wednesday, November 8, at 5:00 p.m. in the **Natural Resources Building, Room (To Be Determined)**.

3. Complete a 30-minute interview between Thursday, November 9, and Friday, November 10. Interviews are available from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; we will add more times if demand increases.

Lynch Family Civility Scholarship. Who qualifies: Undergraduate students enrolled in the College of Social Science who have indicated an interest in promoting civility in public discourse, specifically in the space of public policy, will be eligible for this award. How much: \$1,200. Funds may be used to support tuition, scholarly research, community outreach and engagement, conference attendance, and/or trainings in the public sector. How to apply: Applicants will be asked to write a 1-2 page personal statement a commitment to promoting civility and dialogue in the space of public policy and governance and how they plan to apply the knowledge, skills, and methods they have learned in their everyday lives to advance the impact of civility outside of the classroom. What is it?

MMED began in 2011 through the collaborative work of all of Michigan's medical schools and Pre-Health advisors. It is funded by generous donations from all seven medical schools in Michigan! This in-person event is held every other year.

MMED 2023 will provide pre-medical students from across the state of Michigan with programs designed to help them explore medicine as a career path and make a well-prepared decision to apply to medical school. Students will get the chance to hear directly from medical school admissions representatives and pre-health advisors as they discuss topics ranging from activities, to interviews, to admission criteria.
