

Undergraduate Research Participation Request

Understanding undergraduate sociology students' attitudes on quantitative methods as part of their curriculum.

Is your major in sociology? Are you a junior or senior student? or have you taken SOC 281 and 282 courses?

If yes, I would like you to participate in my study which aims to investigate the attitudes of sociology students about quantitative approaches and methods in sociological issues. You will be asked to answer questions about the extent to which you value and feel comfortable with quantitative methods taught in sociology courses you've taken. Your participation in this study will take about 20-40 minutes. There is little risk or discomfort anticipated. If you ever feel uncomfortable with the nature of any question, it will be skipped.

You will not directly benefit from your participation in this study. However, your participation in this study may yield insightful and general consensus on the status of quantitative methods in the discipline of sociology.

If you agree to participate, our conversation will take place in the main library or, if you please, on a private Zoom meeting. The meeting will be recorded and transcribed but your personal information such as your name or contact details will be recorded elsewhere; that is, your participation in this study is confidential and voluntary.
